

The Bible lesson at the beginning of each lesson is really great. Definitely a God honoring book.

This book engages children and makes learning time fun for the whole family. I love how scripture is incorporated. Perfect for home school science "class."

I love this book and so does my class! Connecting science and the Bible is just wonderful!Most of the items needed for the experiments are very common household items or cheap to buy. It's great for Sunday School classes or School(at least Christian schools!)

Not as dynamic as I was looking for and the 3 experiments I tried did not really work. But the concept is good.

I love books! But I didn't love this one. And I am educated! But this book is very hard to read, and it would be nearly impossible to teach from - you would have to create your own lesson from the tiny tidbits that you could take away from the reading. I hate to be too critical, but this book seems to have been written by a brilliant scientist who is not well able to connect to his audience. While I appreciate his and his publisher's efforts to create a Biblically based science lesson/activity book, this is both too concise and too complicated at the same time. Each lesson is a brief 2 pages, but each one is so disjointed and not well written or edited, that it's virtually unusable. Truly, nearly unreadable. I was hoping for lessons that would easily translate into 20 minute Biblical-science lessons for elementary aged students at our AWANA Bible club, but that could never happen. First, there is nothing there to build a lesson from (sorry, that's how I feel after reading quite a few of the activities!) and yet it was so far over my head that my brain was swimming trying to understand what in the world he was trying to say. I'm sorry, but I can't imagine what this book could be used for. :(Trust me, take a look at the book "Show Me! Devotions" if you're trying to find something like I was looking for. Btw, was GREAT and refunded me for the book, but told me to keep it (ha!)

Lots of fun ideas with clear messages, although they are a little short for my purposes, but I can easily adapt and expand on them. I work with K-2nd grade kids, and they are always asking if I have an "experiment". I have several books I refer to, and this is a good addition to my collection.

I've been teaching Bible stories at the early elementary level for over 15 years and have a college degree in youth ministries. About a year ago I had a high school senior who is looking to go into medicine comment to me that she wished someone had combined science and God for her at a young age. She had grown up feeling they were two separate things. That is what motivated me to buy this book and I've started using it in some oft story introductions. Some of the books' ideas are better than others but overall I love the concept and hope to continue to use it to show kids that God is the God of all things! Including science!
